Advice on completing the Housing Application Form if you would like to be considered for Sheltered Accommodation

LEICESTER CITY COUNCIL SHELTERED ACCOMMODATION

Section 6 of Housing Application Form: What accommodation do you need?

1. Tick Sheltered flat and/or Sheltered bedsit – both have a separate kitchen and bathroom. A flat has a separate bedroom. A bedsit (sometimes called a studio flat) has a lounge/bedroom.
2. Tick 'YES' to the question 'do you want to be considered for council accommodation?'

Section 7 of Housing Application Form: What areas would you prefer?

1. If you would like to be considered for any of our Sheltered Schemes answer 'YES' to this question:

Would you accept a property in any area? YES

2. If there are only **some** Sheltered Schemes you would consider, you must only tick the boxes of the areas in which they are situated. Here is a list of Leicester City Council's Sheltered Schemes and their Allocation Areas. You can tick as many as you like. To get an idea of where there are current vacancies, you can call the Sheltered Housing Team on (0116) 252-6282.

ADAPTED HOUSING IN COUNCIL SHELTERED SCHEMES

The Schemes listed above that are marked with a * have a fully wheelchair accessible flat. Some council Schemes have flats and bedsits/studio flats with walk-in showers.

To be considered for wheelchair accessible flats or walk-in showers you also need to complete the **Adapted Housing Application Form** which is available from any Housing Office or the Housing Options Centre on Bishop Street, next to the main Post Office.

HOUSING ASSOCIATION SHELTERED ACCOMMODATION

If you also want to be considered for Housing Association accommodation, you should go to Section 6 of the Housing Application Form and tick 'YES' to the question, 'Do you want to be considered for nomination to a housing association?'

To be considered for Housing Association wheelchair accessible flats you also need to complete the **Adapted Housing Application Form** which is available from any Housing Office or the Housing Options Centre on Bishop Street, next to the main Post Office.
