

ENERGY EDUCATION

Leicester's Energy Education Project is being developed by the Energy Group and is supported by Leicester Energy Agency and Leicester's Energy Advice Centre. The project will be centered around the use of the Energy Education Resource Pack and the Electric Energy Advice Bus.

The Energy education resource Pack was initially developed by Mid Suffolk District Council and aims to support schools involved in energy education. It provides an introduction to some of the key issues in energy and aims to raise awareness of these issues as well as developing attitudes and value for sustainable lifestyles.

Leicester City Council's Energy Management Group has reproduced this pack with the aim of distributing it free to all city schools. The Electric Energy Advice Bus will promote energy efficiency and the adoption of renewable energy to schools (as well as businesses and households) as well as offering children the chance to learn more about electric vehicles through a website directly linked to the bus, allowing them to follow its performance.



The aim of this project is to develop a framework of support for schools in order to promote awareness and understanding of energy efficiency and renewable energy, and to assist them with teaching these subjects.

The Project is aimed at children of all ages and will incorporate a number of developed educational material targeting all schools within Leicester. School participation will be on a voluntary basis with each participating school receiving a free Energy Education Resource Pack, computer software packages, advice and assistance. Schools will also be able to arrange a visit from the Electric Energy Advice Bus.
